

The Graduate School of Frontier Sciences (GSFS) provides furnished housing at the Kashiwanoha International Village (14Fl. Park Axis Kashiwanoha) adjacent to Kashiwanoha Campus Station for international students, researchers, and some Japanese students as well.

1 Resident Eligibility

- (1) International students admitted or enrolled in GSFS
- (2) Exchange students belonging to official GSFS student exchange programs
- (3) International researchers working at GSFS
- (4) Japanese enrolled students who agree to act as a residence assistant that provides simple interpreting/translation, and other support for the non-Japanese GSFS residents.

University housing policies have been developed to support an environment of mutual respect. Residents are expected to live within the standards of the housing and encourage others to do the same. Residents are responsible for taking ownership in developing a safe, secure, and healthy living environment.

All rooms are for individual use only.

2 Period of stay

- (1) Students: the standard period of academic study for the degree being pursued
In principle, master students 2 years; doctoral students, 3 years
[cf. 「東京大学大学院学則」 (The University of Tokyo Regulations, Article 2 Item 5).
- (2) Researchers: contract period or three (3) years, whichever is shorter
- (3) Residents are expected to occupy the residence space for the contracted period unless some unavoidable circumstances occur.

3 Rent

- (1) The rent shall be fifty five thousand (55,000) yen per month. Should occupancy of university housing be less than one (1) full month, rent for that period shall be pro-rated on a per diem basis.
- (2) Resident must pay sixty five hundred (6,500) yen (excluding consumption tax) when Resident assumes occupancy of housing as pre-payment to cover cleaning expenses incurred upon vacating the rented housing.

4 Damage/Repairs

In the event of any damage to 1) the main structure part of the building; or 2) furniture, appliances, equipment, fixtures, or the like, in the rented housing, kitchen area, and all other spaces of common use by residents is determined to have been the fault of the Resident, the Resident shall assume all financial responsibility thereto in accordance with university regulations.
