Summer Internship Program

Program Overview

UTSIP Kashiwa is an intensive six-week summer program for non-Japanese undergraduates during the summer following their sophomore or junior years, especially for those who plan to apply to the Graduate School of Frontier Sciences at The University of Tokyo for graduate study.

The program aims to expose undergraduates to world-leading research activities in the field of natural science or social science. Some 30 internships are awarded through a competitive process that includes a scholarship and accommodations.

Participants are assigned to a laboratory in which he/she is interested in working, and will conduct a research project under the guidance of a faculty member or senior graduate students.

Fligibility

Applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- 1) must be in their undergraduate program at a college or university, and will not have completed their BA/BS degree before July of the program year for which they are applying
- 2) are considering to matriculate to graduate level study at the Graduate School of Frontier Sciences of The University of Tokyo
- 3) must have completed a minimum of two years of undergraduate coursework by the start of a UTSIP program
- 4) must commit to participating in all UTSIP activities including classes, laboratory work, and events organized by UTSIP

Accommodations
